Back numbers are in great demand to make up sets and the Society would be greateful for any copies handed in. The Journal holds a high reputation for scholarly articles. There is a need for the continuation of the General Index compiled by Mrs. Dorothy Allsopp up to Volume XXXV No. 1.

TALK

At the Annual General Meeting on 14th December 1978 the Minister of Education and Culture the Hon. Mr. Louis Tull spoke on the role of Museums in the Cultural life of a society. His talk was preceded by a short word from the Director on Conservation in Barbados.

MUSEUM WORKSHOP IN JAMAICA

The Director represented the Barbados Museum & Historical Society at a Museum Workshop held in October 1978 in Jamaica. Delegates from the Caribbean, some Latin American Countries and the United States attended. Many important problems of regional Museums were thrashed out. The Director stressed the need for expansion of the Barbados Museum along National lines with greater Governmental support. The Workshop was held in the Kingston Sheraton Hotel and field trips were made to conservation projects at Spanish Town and to Port Royal to observe the results of marine archaeology.

PRIME MINISTER PRESENTS STAMPS

The Prime Minister the Hon. J.M.G.M. Adams presented the Museum with designs of former Barbadian stamps which had been presented to the Government of Barbados by Messrs. Thos de la Rue & Co., of London. The above mentioned firm has promised to supply a burglar proof show case for their display.

VISITOR OF NOTE

The Director-General of UNESCO M. Amadou-Matar M'Bow visited the Museum on 22nd March 1979 while in Barbados for the regional Conference held at Dover Convention Centre which the Museum Director attended.

COURTYARD

The Museum was closed for four months January—April 1979 while the renovations of the Courtyard finally got under way after two years discussions. At times the noise and dust forced the staff to take refuge in the Director's House No. 11 which was converted into a temporary office. The Council would like to convey their appreciation to the staff for their fortitude in carrying on under very difficult conditions. Work was completed and the Landscaping of the grounds was implemented by Mrs. Heather Aguilar.

As the final result stands for all to see there is a stage with flights of steps and brick pathways. Covered verandahs run at intervals along the inside of the courtyard. There are plans for regular evening entertainments to help augment the revenue of the Museum and to convert the Museum into a National Cultural Centre. A plaque to Mrs. Aall's generosity is erected to commenorate the event.

MUSEUM SHOP

A long overdue Museum Shop was opened in the Hall Gallery the design for which was executed by a specially constituted sub-committee. The room was transformed by a draped ceiling and some period furniture brought out of store donated by Mr. & Mrs. Alan Martyr some years before. A Chandelier

was lent by the Director and some period wall lights by Mrs. Roger Goddard. The shop stocks Books on Barbados, the West Indies and regional Natural History, a variety of print reproductions, some genuine bygones, 18th Century bottles, sea shells and imaginative pottery.

REOPENING OF MUSEUM

The Museum was reopened by His Excellency the Governor General the Society's patron at a function on 8th June 1979.

ATTENDENCE

STAFF

Mr. E. G. Queree joined the staff as part time Librarian two days weekly. Besides sorting and arranging he has catalogued all the recent acquisitions. Some volumes of particular importance have been sent to England to be rebound.

GOVERNMENT LOAN

The Council wishes to express its gratitude to the relevant Government Ministry for according the Barbados Museum and Historical Society a loan of \$50,000.00 repayable at the rate of 4% per annum. This is to help offset the serious inroads made into the investments of the Society merely to keep the doors open.

TRANSFER TO MINISTRY OF INFORMATION

As from the 1st April 1979 the Barbados Museum and Historical Society was transferred from the Ministry of Education & Culture to the Ministry of Information. The Director paid a courtesy call on the Minister Senator Nigel Barrow.

SALARIES AND WAGES INCREASE

As from the 1st January 1979 wages were increased in a measure to compensate for the staggering increase of the cost of living. After representation by the entire staff had been made to the President the increases were made retroactive for one year during which negotiations had been in train. The entire staff expresses gratitude to the Council on this account and hopes for like fruition on the questions of status and pensions.

Interest received is treated on a cash basis. No account has been taken for interest accrued at end of year.


4. INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

5. LOAN


This loan, amounting to fifty thousand dollars, is repayable over a ten year period and interest is payable semi-annually at the rate of 4% per annum.
