
Dear Member,

n 27th October, Mrs. Jane Gross and her family, including her husband, children and grandchildren, visited the Barbados Museum while on holiday to view the collection donated by the late Enid Evelyn Hole, Jane's grandmother. The Enid Hole Collection consists of some 8000 shells collected by Mrs. Hole on her travels around the world, including some from the Philippines, Australia, the Mediterranean and the Caribbean. It was a real pleasure to receive the Gross family and the family members in turn were impressed to see that even after 30 years since the donation, that the collection has been maintained and preserved in its entirety for the enjoyment of the public for years to come.

Genealogical Research in Barbados

On 21st October, Mr. Martin Cox gave a special presentation to the History Group and Museum members during which he discussed his experience with conducting genealogical research in Barbados.



Prehistoric Barbados

he Prehistoric Barbados exhibition opened on 9th November and Amerindian Archaeology Week followed to allow members of the public more in-depth knowledge of archaeology in Barbados. The week started with a well attended public lecture at the Museum by Professor Peter L. Drewett, Professor Emeritus of Archaeology at the University of Sussex in the U.K. on 23rd November. His topic was Prehistoric Barbados: 25 Years of Field Research.

It continued with a session on 25th November during which individuals were invited to drop in with their Amerindian finds to have them identified and recorded by Prof. Drewett, his wife, Lysbeth Drewett and Kevin Farmer, BMHS Curator – History & Archaeology.

Dr. Maaike S. de Waal, Lecturer in Archaeology at the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus spoke on the topic From Prehistoric Guadeloupe to Prehistoric Barbados on 27th November at the Museum.

The week culminated with an oversubscribed bus tour to archaeological sites around the island, namely at Silver Sands, Chancery Lane, Three Houses and Hill Crest. The tour was led by Prof. Drewett and Kevin Farmer and it revealed fascinating details of the way of life for the island's first inhabitants and efforts to investigate and preserve what they left behind.

Darwin & Barbados

On 24th November, the Charles Darwin Commemorative Bicentennial lecture entitled Darwin and Barbados was held to mark the 150th anniversary of the publication of "On the Origin of Species". It was delivered by Dr. Louis Chinnery, Senior Lecturer in UWI's Department of Biological and Chemical Sciences and was the first public lecture to be held in the new Medical Sciences Lecture Theatre at the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill, St. Michael. Darwin the man, his family ties, his mentors, and his "natural selection" theory were examined.

This lecture was hosted by the Barbados Museum & Historical Society, in conjunction with the Department of Biological and Chemical Sciences of the University of the West Indies.

Participants in the Barbados DNA Project received their results on 27th November and found them "fascinating". When the results are made public we're sure you will too!

Caribbean Curatorship & National Identity

Curatorship & National Caribbean Identity was the theme of the Museums Association of the Caribbean (MAC) 21st Annual General Meeting, which was held in collaboration with the Barbados National Committee of the International Council of Museums (ICOM), National Art Gallery Committee, International Curators Forum, Andy Warhol Foundation for Visual Arts and the Cultural Leadership Programme of the British Arts Council. The conference was held from 29th November to 2nd December and the response from both the regional and international arts community was overwhelming.

The Story of Lace Bark Doilies

doily (doilie or doyley) is an ornamental mat, usually made of cotton or linen thread, crocheted or knitted. Doilies are highly decorative and can be seen in many Bajan homes protecting wood furniture from scratches or placed on tables for decoration. Disposable paper doilies have become quite common today, food, usually pastries, for ornamentation.

Making doilies is often considered oldfashioned, but contemporary designers continue to make patterns for modern hand craft enthusiasts.

Lace bark doilies, as the name suggests,

are made from the bark of trees which are intricately cut into detailed one-of-a-kind designs.

According to the Encyclopaedia Britannica, Eleventh Edition, "The lace-bark tree is a tree native to Jamaica, known botanically as Lagetta lintearia, from its native used in the culinary circles, underlying the name lagetto. The tree belongs to the family Thymelaeaceae, and is grown in greenhouses in Great Britain." The inner bark consists of numerous concentric layers of interlacing fibres resembling lace. Collars and other articles of apparel have been made of this fibre, which is also used in the manufacture of whips.

The earliest donation of lace bark doilies to The Barbados Museum were made by the late Mrs. Thomas Goddard and given by Mrs. C. Gardner on February 24, 1937. The most recent, was a donation of six doilies made out of the bark of the Lagetta lintearia tree, which is native to Jamaica, and trimmed with French cotton. These were made by the late Barbadian Miss. Ada Bovell, and donated by Mr. Robert Mucci, of the UK, on February 26, 2009.

Look out for the lace bark doilie on display in the Jubilee Gallery during your next visit to the Museum.




