

Museums & Memory: Home Sweet Home

An exhibition to mark this year's theme for International Museum Day, "Museums & Memory", was mounted in May and memories of domestic life in Barbados between the 1930s and 1960s were brought to life in the form of installations of rooms from that period. This exhibition was highlighted during the guided tours that were offered on Museum Open Day on May 21 and it helped many visitors to relive fond memories.

A Century of Electricity in Barbados

The Barbados Light and Power Company Limited (BL&P) commissioned the Barbados Museum and Historical Society to produce an exhibition to commemorate its centenary this year. The exhibition was launched on June 15, BL&P employees were allowed private viewings up to June 17 and the exhibition opened to the public from June 18. It continues until September 15.

Members' Lounge debuts at Evening Reception



The well-attended reception was catered by Anna Went, and entertainment provided by David Hutchinson of Pangroove Elegant Events.





The Oliver Messel Archive

On March 11, Anne Grieg a paper conservator from the V&A Museum in London delivered a talk on the Oliver Messel Archive. This lecture, hosted by the Barbados Museum & Historical Society, was held at Fustic House in St. Lucy.

Fustic is said to be Messel's favourite out of several houses he designed on the island of Barbados, and he remodelled it from a rough 18th plantation farm into an estate of 'tearing beauty' for the brother of writer and classicist Robert Graves.

Oliver Messel (1904 – 1978) was an English artist and one of the foremost stage designers of the 20th century.

World Heritage Inscription

On June 25, it was announced that Barbados had been approved for inscription into the World Heritage list. The BMHS is proud to have been instrumental in this achievement through the contributions of its Director, Alissandra Cummins and Curator – History & Archaeology, Kevin Farmer, in their roles on the Barbados World Heritage Committee. The vast majority of the images that made the nomination dossier a well-illustrated document came from the BMHS' collection. Look out for exciting activities to educate the public about the "outstanding universal value" of Bridgetown and the Garrison.

New Acquisitions

A musical saw, also called a "singing saw" - a hand saw that was used as a musical instrument, was presented by Ms. Selma Cadogan to the Museum, along with a monetary donation. Her brother was on hand to demonstrate how the instrument used to be played by their father. The Cadogans who reside in the United States felt that the Museum is the best place for the unusual instrument to be kept and preserved and we were honoured to receive it, along with biographical information on their father, who passed away on June 05, 1970. He was born on November 15, 1902.

The framing of the photograph and accompanying biography had been coordinated by the Barbados Association of Retired Persons (BARP). Mr. Sisnett turned 111 years of age on February 22, 2011. Library News

New Additions

n the two-month period April to May, 61 new items were added to the collection. This comprises both purchases and donations; the most significant being 49 books donated by Yasmin Dean-Wason from the estate of her uncle, Rex Wason.

Rex Wason joined the Barbados Museum and Historical Society on May 30, 1996. His love and commitment to the Society were evident when, just before his death on March 23, 2011, he donated his 1951 Lodge School blazer and a refractometer from his days as a sugar technologist. It is therefore quite fitting that his books should find a home at the institution he loved.

A Barbadian by birth, Rex Wason spent most of his working life in the sugar industry, having worked in Barbados, Grenada, Jamaica, Belize and London. Holding to the belief that "If we are to heed the past to prepare for the future we should listen to these quiet voices of a generation that speaks to us of duty and honour, sacrifice and accomplishments," Rex embarked on a career of public service. Organisations such as The St. John's Ambulance Brigade, the Barbados National Trust, the Royal Commonwealth Society, the West India Committee in London, the Barbados Boy Scouts Association, the Duke of Edinburgh Award programme, The Salvation Army, the Rotary Club of Barbados and of course, the Barbados Museum and Historical Society all benefited from Rex's call to duty. To

perpetuate his memory, a Rex Wason Collection has been opened within the Library's computerised catalogue. In this way, although his books may be physically dispersed on the shelves, they are brought together intellectually for research and in memoriam.



On June 29, the Library received a surprise visit from Cecil Maxwell Shilstone Jr., his wife Sandra and their two sons Spencer and Cameron. The visitors were eager to learn about Cecil's great uncle Eustace Maxwell Shilstone, who was the driving force behind the formation of the Barbados Museum and Historical Society, serving as its Honorary Secretary from 1933 until 1959 and as President from 1959-1961.

The Shilstone family, who reside in New Orleans, were given a glimpse of the outstanding contribution of their ancestor by the Librarian, Harriet Pierce, and Researcher, Miguel Pena, whose article "Eustace Maxwell Shilstone: the Man not the Museum" appeared in Volume 44 of the Journal. The family was particularly interested in the Shilstone notebooks and the memorial plaque which was erected in 1973 when a refurbished Museum Library was reopened as the Shilstone Memorial Library.

The Library offered genealogical research services free of cost during Cultural Heritage Week, May 16 to 20. It was a fitting activity to mark the theme of International Museum Day, "Museums and Memory."

Retirement Wishes and Appreciation for the former Deputy Director

the heartfelt appreciation expressed by Council and Staff to retiring Deputy Director Dr. Thomas Loftfield, but also the commitment and passion that Dr. Loftfield brought to his tenure at the Barbados Museum & Historical Society (BMHS).

Dr. Loftfield, who retired on May 31, was presented with an 'award of thanks' during an intimate gathering of council members and staff on his last day. Director Alissandra Cummins acknowledged his outstanding service and dedicated leadership since joining the staff full-time in 2005. Prior to serving as Deputy Director, he was also affiliated with the Museum on a consultancy basis for at least four years. His Deputy Director's responsibilities included heading the Curatorial Department.

"In the four and half years which I have worked at the BMHS I have observed Tom as being a hands-on type of Deputy Director," stated Acting Assistant Curator/Researcher Miguel Pena, who first met Professor Loftfield eleven years ago while still a student at the University of the West Indies. "Tom was always willing to assist, and provide the moral support required to get the job done."

According to Mr. Pena, "patience and honesty were and are important qualities of the man who I have been proud to be taught by, worked with and befriended." Speaking on behalf of his Curatorial Department colleagues, Mr. Pena said Dr. Loftfield's presence at the BMHS would be missed but encouraged him to enjoy his retirement as it "had been well earned".

Ms. Cummins emphasized that a special plaque presented to Dr. Loftfield, as well as a bouquet of flowers to his wife Kathleen who served in the Friends of the Museum support group, were but

small tokens of appreciation for their commitment to the Museum and heritage preservation endeavors. In his remarks, BMHS Council President Dr. Trevor Carmichael, added that he could always count on Dr. Loftfield's reliability in achieving objectives when called upon. He also cited various projects, including the new Museum Entrance/Gift Shop, which the former Deputy Director spearheaded to bring on-stream.

The Deputy Director, whose tenure was highlighted in a slide show, also received thanks for his active support of philanthropic initiatives which he championed to encourage growth of private contributions to the Museum.






Call For Library Volunteers
