

Charter of Barbados Lecture

On January 16 at the Christ Church Foundation School, the Barbados Museum & Historical Society hosted a lecture entitled "The Legacy of the Barbados Charter", delivered by Professor Pedro Welch, to mark the 360th anniversary of the signing of the Charter of Barbados. The packed audience included Chief Justice of Barbados, The Hon. Marston Gibson.

HARP Gun Hike

On January 28, 100 people took part in the Barbados Museum and Historical Society's scenic hike from Foul Bay, St. Philip to the HARP Gun in Christ Church.

The High Altitude Research Project (HARP) was based on a flight range of the Seawell Airport in Barbados, from which shells were fired eastward toward the Atlantic Ocean.

In 1966, the HARP gun fired a projectile to 112 miles high, a world record that still stands.

2012 Lecture Series Launch

This year's Lecture Series was officially launched on January 23. Nine lectures and a panel discussion were scheduled to take place between February 7 and April 17, at the Queen's Park Steel Shed, under the theme "This is the Time to Knock on the Door of your Government" (Clement Payne): The 1937 Labour Rebellion.



Basic Genealogy Workshop

The Basic Genealogy
Workshop organised by the
Shilstone Memorial Library
was held on March 17.
Although it was developed
and marketed as a basic
workshop, the event
attracted novices as well
as several experienced
family researchers. Reasons
given by participants for
attending the event ranged
from the need to network,

to the desire to develop the requisite skills and confidence to make a start. Director of the BMHS Alissandra Cummins delivered the opening remarks to the twenty-three participants that included two members of the press.

The workshop was aimed at demystifying the process of family research, while outlining the types of resources that are available in and outside of Barbados as well as online. Dr. Patricia Stafford presented two sessions: "Getting Started" and "The Process." Librarian, Harriet Pierce, presented a session entitled "Genealogical Sources within the Shilstone Memorial Library." The workshop culminated with a case study of the "Forte Family Research Project 2008," which was presented by Janice Forte.

During the four sessions, the presenters shared their knowledge, while encouraging attendees to ask questions and share their own experiences. This led to lively and informative discussion. Participants were presented with certificates of participation by Deputy Director Kevin Farmer, who also presented tokens of appreciation to Dr. Stafford and Janice Forte.

From the camaraderie exhibited among participants and their comments on the evaluation forms, the workshop lived up to and in some cases exceeded the expectations of some participants. In order to keep the momentum going, the formation of a genealogy group was proposed. Such a group, which will be launched later in the year, would meet at the Museum on a regular basis to share problems and possible solutions, and to generally offer support and assistance to members.

Visit by the Earl of Harewood

On February 21, David Lascelles, the eighth Earl of Harwood, his wife Diane, and Terence Suthers, formerly of Harewood House Trust, visited the Barbados Museum and Historical Society. The Earl and Countess were given a tour of the Shilstone Memorial Library by the Librarian, Harriet Pierce, who later took the couple to view the mini-exhibition entitled "West India Affairs: the Legacy of the Lascelles." The main focus of the exhibition was the two portraits of Edwin Lascelles, the first Baron of Harewood and Edward Lascelles, the first Earl of Harewood. The portraits of these two Barbadian-born aristocrats previously graced the walls of Parliament before being placed in storage at the Barbados Museum and Historical Society. In light of their physical deterioration, the portraits underwent a process of conservation which carried out by Lidia Aravena-Carrillo and Luis Larrazábal of the Museo De Arte De Ponce in Puerto Rico.

Other items on display included an original copy of the 1786 publication "Instructions for the Management of a Plantation in Barbadoes and for the Treatment of Negroes" written by Edwin Lascelles and nine other planters and a copy of the "Lascelles Maxwell Letterbook for the Year 1743", which was donated to the BMHS on February 1, 1963, by the company, now renamed Wilkinson and Gaviller.

The Lascelles who built Harewood House in England were the owners of several plantations in Barbados. They were in the business of sugar and the slave trade and were bankers, mainly for West Indian plantation owners, and traders of considerable entrepreneurial initiative.

Following the tour of the Library and the mini-exhibition, Deputy Director Kevin Farmer led the visitors on a tour of the Harewood Galley, which was named in honour of the sixth Earl of Harewood. Later, the Earl presented a copy of the Lascelles Slavery Archive to the Director and President of the Barbados Museum and Historical Society. This presentation was the result of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), which was signed at the University of the West Indies on February 20. The MOU was signed by representatives of the BMHS, Harewood House Trust, the University of York and UWI. The main feature for the public on February 21 was a talk by the Earl, entitled "Landscape and History: Re-framing Harewood," which was delivered to over 100 people. The address reviewed the historical links between the Lascelles family and Barbados and the more recent efforts of the Harewood House Trust to establish cultural links with the Caribbean. To this end, the Earl spoke about the alliance with the late Trinidadian artist Geraldine Connor and the staging of her play the "Carnival Messiah" on the grounds of Harewood House in celebration of the bicentenary of the Abolition of the Slave Trade. The Carnival Messiah is a Caribbeanised version of Handel's Messiah. Quite appropriately the Earl ended his talk with an extract from the production which featured the performance of the song "I Know that my Redeemer Liveth."

On February 22, the Earl and party were taken of a tour of the Garrison Historic area by Assistant Curator – History, Miguel Pena, and Deputy Director Kevin

Farmer. Three notable stops on the itinerary included: the National Armoury and Cannon Collection, where the Earl and his party were taken on a tour by Major Michael Hartland; the Main Guard, where they witnessed the Changing of the Sentry and finally a tour of George Washington House.

President of the Barbados Museum and Historical Society hosted the Earl and his party at a luncheon held at Tapas Restaurant.

also attended the event. The Earl and Countess were both conferred with Life Memberships of the BMHS.

In Search of a Norwegian Ancestor


On February 27 Norwegian Sidsel Jorgenson visited the Library in search of information on her great great grandfather Adolf August Barth, a Norwegian ship's captain who lived in Barbados from 1885 until 1897 with his wife Ingeborg Marie and his sons Caspar and Klaus. According to Sidsel's records, which included a Cooper photograph, the family lived at Kensington at the time of Mrs. Barth's death in 1897. She died after a fall down the stairs.

After her initial visit to the Library, Sidsel went away with the knowledge that in 1887 her ancestor worked as a clerk and lived at White Park Road. The Westbury Cemetery Burial records also confirmed that her great great grandmother was in fact buried at Westbury Cemetery. The next task was to establish whether or not Captain Barth lived at Kensington House.


A check of the plantation records showed that in 1927 the house was purchased by J.N. Goddard from Mrs. F.C. Bancroft. We thought that contacting the Goddard family should therefore prove to be useful. Council Member Richard Goddard agreed to meet with Sidsel and through a comparison of his family photograph with one taken on the day of Ingeborg Marie's funeral, was able to identify the house in which Captain Barth lived as Kensington Manor. The house, which later became the vicarage for St. Mary's Anglican Church, was demolished during the physical redevelopment of Kensington Oval for ICC Cricket World Cup 2007. Mr. Goddard also elected to take Sidsel to Fontabelle to point out the exact site where the house was located.

After a four-week stay in Barbados Sidsel still had questions, but she also had answers. She knew much more about her great great grandfather than when she had landed, including the possibility of a first marriage which had to be confirmed on her return to Norway where the search would continue.


Sidsel Jorgenson speaking with Richard Goddard and Librarian, Harriet Pierce.

Conserving our Heritage

As we seek to fulfill the BMHS' mandate to preserve its collections for future generations, during the period from February 2 to 10, conservators Ms. Lidia Aravena-Carrillo and Luis Lazarabal from the Museo De Arte De Ponce in Puerto Rico conducted an assessment on the Barbados Gallery of Art's new acquisitions of Fine Art, and also completed conservation work on the portraits of Edward Earl of Harewood and the Right Hon. Edwin Baron of Harewood from the Parliament Collection.



Vendors sold traditional Bajan food, confectionary and other sweet treats, local wines and vegetables. The Library's Book Stall did a brisk trade in the sale of used books and the Shilstone Memorial Library also mounted a mini-exhibition to highlight Historic Bridgetown and its Garrison. The Nomination Dossier and Management Plan, along with other source documents and images of yesteryear from within the site were showcased. The display remained on view until April 12.
