### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL 1969 - 1970

The Council has pleasure in presenting its Report on the affairs of the Society for the year 1st May 1969 to 30th April 1970.

#### COUNCIL

Mr. H. Blair Bannister, being the Member of the Council who had served longest, retired under Article V Section 6. Mrs. Elsie Payne, Ph.D., was elected to the vacancy thus created.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

At 1st May 1969 there were 466 members on the roll of the Society and on 30th April 1970 there were 480, comprising Founder Members 1, Honorary Members 2, Life Members 50, Annual Members 287, Firm & Company Members 13 and 128 Associate Members. #### LOSS OF . MEMBERSHIP

The Council deeply regrets to record the death of Mr. E. M. Shilstone, O.B.E., a Founder Member who was Hon. Secretary of the Society from 1933-1959 and President of the Society from 1959-1961. The Society owes Mr. Shilstone an irreparable debt for his work on its behalf. The Council also regrets to record the death of three Annual Members; Mr. Leonard Knight, Mr. R. Bruce Skeete and Mr. Henry A. C. Thomas.

#### **EXHIBITIONS**

During the year the following exhibitions were held: School Children's Art Exhibition, the Society's Collection of Paintings, Recent Acquisitions, School Children's Handicrafts, Haitian Paintings, Orchid Circle Exhibition, Contemporary Art and one man exhibitions by J. A. Gairdner and Robert J. MacLeod.

#### OTHER ACTIVITIES

Mr. E. Graham Gooding M.A., gave a talk at the Annual Meeting of the Society on "Historical Relics in the Flora of Barbados".

The Barbados National Trust, the Barbados Weather Observers Association, the Barbados Horticultural Society, the Cactus Society, the Orchid Circle and the Barbados Civic Circle all held meetings at the Society's Headquarters.

#### **VISITORS**

H.R.H. the Princess Alice, Countess of Athlone visited the Orchid Exhibition at the Museum. Among the other visitors to the Museum were a group from the Society of Architectural Historians, Friends of the American Museum in England and the Deputy Director-General of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation Dr. Malcolm Adiseshiah and other UNESCO representatives.

#### SOCIETY'S HEADQUARTERS

The Council wishes to express its appreciation to Government for the Annual Grant and for funds provided to enable the Ministry of Communications and Works to carry out repairs at these Headquarters. The verandah to the east of the office and work room which was destroyed by hurricane "Janet" in 1955 has been replaced. This is a great improvement as the verandah roof has been raised and it enables visitors to keep under cover on rainy days. The Society carried out minor repairs amounting to \$651.78.

#### MUSEUM & LIBRARY

During the year the Society received a highly important gift to the Library, namely the collection of maps of Barbados and the West Indies formed by the late Eustace Maxwell Shilstone donated by Mrs. E. M. Shilstone. Mrs. Shilstone also generously presented to the Society the collection of West Indiana in Mr. Shilstone's Library which the Society's Library did not already possess. Mrs. Shilstone's gift included 26 maps and 17 photostats, 54 books, 67 pamphlets and diaries, notebooks and files containing historical and genealogical material.

Other gifts included a number of specimens of glass and china from Miss Ailsa Fleming; Mr. Jack Warmington added to his former gifts an important collection of 19th century glass as well as other specimens. From Major S. F. Cave 4 photostats relating to the Garrison Buildings. Mrs. Katherine Jenkings gave a silver tea spoon about 1800, a Stevenson plate 1810-35, and a milk glass swan salt cellar c. 1880. Mr. Lawrance Greaves gave a plate of Rye pottery commemorating the Investiture of H. R. H. the Prince of Wales, 1969 and Mr. A. G. Nanton a collection of stone implements from St. Vincent.

Dr. E. M. McConney continued his work on the Nominal Index of the Journal. This painstaking work has proved most valuable to the Museum.

#### **JOURNAL**

Two Journals and two Bulletins were published during the year. The Council wishes to thank advertisers for advertising in the Journal.

For Christmas the Society sold Christmas cards with reproductions of two prints in the Cunard Gallery. This proved to be popular amongst our members and it is hoped to repeat this again.

#### CHILDREN'S SECTION

During the year groups from 11 schools attended classes held at the Museum. Illustrated talks were given on "Oil", "The Geology of Barbados", and "Volcanoes". The total number attending these classes was 1030.

The School children's Art Exhibition and the School-children's Handicrafts Exhibition were held during the year. The latter exhibition received less exhibits than usual.

#### MUSEUM COLLECTIONS FUND

Purchases made by means of this Fund were chiefly to fill gaps in the Society's collection. For this reason the specimens purchased cost considerably more than was the case a few years ago, owing to the rise in the cost of antiques. A Meissen cabaret of about 1830 consisting of a coffee pot, milk jug, sugar bowl, cup and saucer and tray of about 1830 was among the purchases. Other purchases included specimens of glass, Chinese export ware, etc.

Donations from Barbados Light & Power Co. Ltd., Mt. Gay Distilleries Ltd., West India Rum Refinery Co., Ltd., Mrs. J. A. Haynes, Mrs. H. W. Ince, Mr. S. Strouse and Dr. E. M. McConney were also gratefully received.

The Society received a bequest of \$1,000.00 from Mr. L. E. Howard-Taylor, a former Life Member, and a bequest of \$480.00 from Miss Olive Inniss. The Simpson Fund of \$240.00, 3% Savannah Club Debentures, was paid up during the year and the proceeds placed in a fixed deposit at Barclays Bank D.C.O.

The Council is again indebted to Messrs. Pannell, Fitzpatrick & Co., the Society's Honorary Auditors for freely giving its services.

The Council is grateful for voluntary help with the Journal to Mrs. H. W.
