#### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL 1972 - 1973

The Council has pleasure in presenting its Report on the affairs of the Society for the year 1st. May, 1972 to 30th. April, 1973.

#### COUNCIL

The Council welcomes Mrs. Elsie Payne, Ph.D., (Cantab.), Headmistress of Queen's College and Dr. Woodville K. Marshall, B.A., Ph.D., Senior lecturer in History, Dean of the Faculty of Arts and General Studies of the U.W.I., as new Council Members.

Mr. Trevor Bowring who was Honorary Treasurer for many years retired on leaving the Island to reside abroad. The Council wishes to record his very valuable contribution to the Society.

The Council records with the greatest regret the death of the Director, Mr. Neville C. Connell on 19th. January 1973. The value of Mr. Connell's contribution to the Barbados Museum is not easy to estimate nor as a Director will he be easily replaced. The vacant post was advertised.

Mr. R. V. Taylor was appointed Director and assumed duties on 15th. March 1973. It is proposed to send Mr. Taylor on a course of study abroad. Dr. Woodville Marshall and Mr. R. T. A. Johnson were appointed as a special committee to look after the arrangements for such.

#### LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP

#### OTHER ACTIVITIES

Dr. Louis Lemieux and Mr. Hugh Schultz, Director and Deputy Director of the Canadian National Museum of Natural Sciences paid a visit to the Museum on 17th. February. They were accompanied by Mr. Mohammed Hanif, Executive Director of the Caribbean Conservation Association. They were met by the President of the Society and several members of the Council and escorted on a tour of the Museum.

Lady Chandler gave a talk on "Antique Glass Paperweights" and a vivid description of her visit to the factories producing them in France, Scotland and England.

The Barbados National Trust, the Barbados Weather Observers Association and the Barbados Horticultural Society, all held meetings at the Society's headquarters.

Dr. James Lazell of the National Geographic Society paid several visits to the Museum during the month of February. He was attached to the Bellairs Institute and was doing research on the Barbados Racoon, which he hoped was still Extant. Permission was granted for him to have the Museum's stuffed specimen X-rayed. He presented to the Museum a stuffed specimen of the Barbados Monkey.

#### SOCIETY'S HEADQUARTERS

The Council wishes to express its appreciation to Government for the annual grant to assist with the running of the Museum and to enable the Ministry of Communications to begin the conversion of the Director's former Quarters into a new exhibition gallery to be called "The Warmington Gallery. The late Mr. Jack Warmington left the Museum the choice of his personal effects, Jewellery, etc., and one quarter of the residue of his estate. These objects d'art of great value will be placed on permanent exhibition in the Gallery to be called after its benefactor. The reconversion got under way in February under the capable supervision of Mr. David Rundle, R.I.B.A.

#### WARMINGTON GALLERY

Certain proceeds from the sale of surplus furniture given to the Museum by the late Mr. J. E. Warmington are being used in the decoration of the New Gallery which will house most of the Warmington Collection. The Council is grateful to Mr. Harold Bowen for waiving the commission on the sale normally due him. The Council also wishes to record its grateful appreciation of the wise counsel of the Solicitors in the administration of Mr. Warmington's estate.

#### **JOURNAL**

Owing to the steep increase in the cost of producing the Journal it was possible to publish only one Number of the Journal and the Annual Report. The Council is most grateful to Mr. Peter Campbell for having undertaken the editorship of the Journal.

#### CHILDREN'S SECTION

During the year groups of 12 Schools attended talks given at the Museum on "Soufriere, St. Vincent and other Valcanoes". The total number of children was 342. Owing to the death of Mr. Neville Connell all other scheduled classes were temporarily suspended. It is proposed to revive these in due course.

#### MUSEUM COLLECTIONS FUND

Purchases were made of a Spode hot water Plate, part of the service belonging to Gov. Sir Evan McGregor. Three pieces of Jesuit-Ware which is a rare form of Chinese export porcelain were purchased. A sepia drawing of Stephney House, St.George signed and dated 1831 was purchased.
