

Millennium journal launched

The Journal of the Barbados Museum & Historical Society Volume XLVII, November 2001 was successfully launched on November 28, 2001 just in time for the national Independence celebrations. Dr. Karl Watson, Editor of the journal describes this issue of the journal as the "millennium issue and the largest and the best journal." The cover and lead article celebrates the 250th anniversary of the visit of George and Lawrence Washington to Barbados.

Research tool

Dr. Carmichael, president of the Barbados Museum & Historical Society, in his feature address highlighted the importance of this publication as a research tool for many local, regional and international researchers and praised the publication for its longevity and the quality of the articles since 1933.
