# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL 1965—1966

The Council has pleasure in presenting its Report on the affairs of the Society for the year 1st May 1965 to 30th April 1966.

#### COUNCIL

Under Article V, Section 6, Ronald Tree Esq., being the Member of the Council other than an Officer, who had served the longest number of years, retired from the Council. In his stead Captain W. H. R. Armstrong was elected; Membership of the Council was otherwise unchanged.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

At 1st May 1965 there were 381 Members on the roll of the Society and on 30th April 1966, there were 388, comprising Founder Members 2, Honorary Members 2, Life Members 43, Annual Members 229, Firm and Company Members 9, and Associate Members 103.

#### LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP

#### **EXHIBITIONS**

The following exhibitions were held: Schoolchildren's Art Exhibition, the Society's collection of pictures, Schoolchildren's Handicrafts, Horticultural Society Exhibition, Contemporary Painting and one-man exhibitions by R. J. MacLeod and Leslie Lounsbury, and an exhibition by Fielding Babb, C. Murrell and C. M. Drakes.

#### OTHER ACTIVITIES

A lecture was given at a Meeting of the Society by Professor Ripley P. Bullen, Chairman of the Department of Social Sciences of the University of Florida on

"Barbados and the Archaeology of the Lesser Antilles". Professor and Mrs. Bullen were in Barbados for several weeks. They inspected many of the archaeological sites and carried out excavations at several places and examined the archaeological collections of Mr. & Mrs. G E. Clark-Holman. The Director and Mr. Ronald Taylor assisted Professor and Mrs. Bullen in their archaeological survey.

The Graphic Arts Committee of the Barbados Arts Council, the Barbados National Trust, the Barbados Horticultural Society, the Orchid Circle, the Cactus Society and Women's Civic Circle held their meetings at

the Society's Headquarters.

#### PROPOSED SUGAR GALLERY

The Council has in mind the building and equipping of a Gallery devoted to the Sugar Industry, which would be an exhibit where the history of sugar production could be studied. Barbados was the first British territory on which sugar was cultivated as a crop and it was here that many new sugar cane seedlings were bred. It is, therefore, fitting that such an exhibit should be at the Barbados Museum, and this scheme is under consideration.

#### CHILDREN'S SECTION

Eleven schools sent groups to classes held here each term in the Children's Museum. Talks illustrated by an epidiascope and Museum specimens were given on "Reefs", "Arawaks and Caribs" and a "Tour of the Museum."

In June-July, the Schoolchildren's Art Exhibition was held and in November the Handicrafts exhibition took place. Both exhibitions were well represented.

#### CUNARD GALLERY

The Cunard Gallery was opened by the Premier, Hon. Errol Barrow on 6th October 1965 and has aroused much interest among visitors to the Museum.

#### SOCIETY'S HEADQUARTERS

The Council wishes to express its appreciation to Government for funds provided in 1964—65 by means of which a concrete floor was laid in the entrance gallery and this room was redecorated. British American Tobacco Co. Ltd., generously bore the cost of covering this cement floor with terrazza tiles.

#### MUSEUM & LIBRARY

During the year several gifts were made to the Museum and Library. Dr. E. M. McConney has completed the Index to Volume XX of the Society's Journal and has presented a copy to the Library. Dr. McConney's painstaking task is of immense value. Captain W. H. R. Armstrong presented a collection of 30 pamphlets on Barbados and the West Indies. Mr. & Mrs. George Ingham presented a pair of silver salt cellars of 1808; Mr. Jack Warmington added to his previous gifts seven silver tea spoons dating from 1732 to 1800. Miss E. Hester Eversley gave a baccarat glass and a Clichy paperweight. From Hon. C. W. W. Greenidge came a circular pedestal dining table about 1800 formerly at Government House, Nevis, and at which Nelson is said to have dined. From the same donor came a chair from a 1st class carriage of the Barbados Light Railway.

#### MUSEUM COLLECTIONS FUND

During the year purchases were made by the Museum Collections Fund amounting to \$1,578.25 The Council is indebted for donations to this Fund to the American Women's Club, Mrs. A. Colls, Mrs. E. During the year the number of acquisitions to the Museum & Library amounted to 154 of which 69 were acquired by purchase and 85

by gift.

#### JOURNAL

The Council is grateful to advertisers for their continued support without which publication of the Journal would not be possible. Two Journals and 2 Bulletins were published during the year.
